

# The Invisible Deck

**EASY TO PERFORM!**

An apparently invisible deck is offered to the spectator to choose a card and replace it back in the deck upside down. The magi then produces this deck with the pretend card just chosen upside down in the real deck.

## THE INVISIBLE DECK

The principle of the rough-and-smooth cards is used. This principle allows the cards to adhere to each other when placed back-to-back. A total of 26 pairs of cards make up the deck. If you add up both side of a pair, it comes out to 13. This is very important, and the basis for finding the selected card. All even valued cards are on one side and all odd valued cards are on the other. (jacks = 11, Queens = 12, Kings = 13) Black Kings are even, Red Kings are odd. Hearts are backed with Spades, Diamonds are backed with Clubs.

### The even order is as follows :

2 Diamonds back with the Jack of Clubs

Six of Diamonds is backed with the 7 of Clubs

10 of Diamonds is backed with the 3 of Clubs

King of Clubs is backed with the King of Diamonds

4 of Hearts is backed with the 9 of Spades

8 of Hearts is backed with the 5 of Spades

Queen of Hearts is backed with the Ace of Spades

10 of Hearts is backed with the 3 of Spades

6 of Hearts is backed with the 7 of Spades

2 of Hearts is backed with the Jack of Spades

Queen of Diamonds is backed with the Ace of Clubs

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6 of Spades is backed with the 7 of Hearts

10 of Spades is backed with the 3 of Hearts

**Effect:** Remove a deck of "invisible cards" from your pocket. Ask a spectator to remove the "invisible cards" from the box and shuffle them. Next, have him spread the "cards" face down on the table and remove any one. Have him "show" his imaginary card to the audience, but make sure he doesn't show it to you! Of course, he is to remember the name of his card! Now ask him to take the deck and spread it face-up on the table. He is to replace his card face down into the face-up deck. You take back the "invisible cards" and put them back in your pocket. Remove a deck of visible cards from your pocket. Ask the spectator to name his card. Spread the deck. One card is seen to be face down. The card is turned over and proves to be the selected card!! A miracle.

**Secret:** The principle of rough-and-smooth cards is used. This principle allows the cards to adhere to each other when placed back-to-back. A total of 26 pairs of cards make up the deck. If you add up both sides of a pair, it comes out to 13. This is very important, and the basis for finding the selected card. All even valued cards are on one side and all odd valued cards are on the other. (Jacks=11; Queens=12; Kings=13). Black Kings are even; Red Kings are odd. Hearts are backed with Spades; Diamonds are backed with Clubs.

To find the selected card:

- (1) Once the spectator has named his card, determine if it is an even or odd card. Bring out the real deck with the correct side up.
- (2) Spread the cards between your hands, keeping some pressure on the pairs so they do not separate.
- (3) Look for the card that, when added to the selected card, comes out 13. For example. If the selected card was the 5 of clubs, you spread through the cards looking for the 8 of diamonds, The 5 of clubs will be right behind the 8. When you get to the 8 of diamonds, separate the roughed pair, which will show the back of the 5 of clubs. All the other cards in the deck will appear face-up. Remove the face-down card and of course it will be the selected card!

**Note:** Pressure on the cards will keep them in pairs. A light touch will separate the pair, showing the selected card.

It is important to replace the selected card back in the same place in the deck when you are done. That way, you will be ready for repeat performances.
